MOTHER AND UNBORN BABY CARE NAMES GREG FOSTER TO BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Foster brings management and volunteer experience to this role

SOUTHFIELD, Mich., November 17, 2017 – Mother and Unborn Baby Care recently named Gregory H. Foster to its Board of Directors. Foster, a volunteer for MAUBC’s material support program since 2014, repairs donated baby cribs to meet modern safety standards. In addition to continuing to share his hands-on skills to this lifesaving program, which encourages abortion-vulnerable mothers to continue their pregnancies, he will bring significant management and other community service experience to the MAUBC Board role.

“Greg has assisted Mother and Unborn Baby Care through three years of volunteer service, and we are fortunate that he will be taking on a greater role in the future of the organization,” said MAUBC Board Chair Jack McGrath. “This Board appointment is a natural extension of his longtime support of our mission, and we are delighted to have Greg join our dedicated Board.”

During his 32 years working for Detroit Edison, the principal operating electric subsidiary of DTE Energy, Foster held management positions of increasing responsibility in Regulatory Affairs, Corporate Strategy and the Electric Choice program.

Foster, who retired in 2011, received a BS degree in Industrial Engineering from the University of Michigan and an MBA from the University of Detroit. In addition to MAUBC, he currently serves on the Board of Directors and is a past Board Chair of the Plymouth Community United Way. He also is a past volunteer of the St. Aloysius Food Pantry in Detroit and Metro Charter School in Romulus and is active in his church, Our Lady of Good Counsel.

He and his wife, Judy, live in Plymouth and have two grown sons and five grandchildren.

Foster will serve a two-year term, which began in Oct. 2017.
