Dear Friend of MAUBC,

PRAYER

On May 12, our spiritual director, Fr. Joe Lang, led us in consecrating Mother and Unborn Baby Care to Our Lady of Guadalupe after mass at the National Shrine of the Little Flower Basilica. The only apparition of Our Lady with Child was at Guadalupe. We need the Blessed Mother's constant intercession for our critical work. I humbly ask that you join me in praying daily to Our Lady of Guadalupe for the conversion of hearts and for the salvation of souls.

THE SANCTITY OF CONCEPTION

The idea that life begins at conception is not a new belief for Catholics. I remember a sermon on this topic preached by Fr. John West, God rest his soul. He pointed out that on March 25, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Annunciation, when Our Lord was conceived. That date is also the spring equinox, considered the day that God began his act of creating the world, so it is only appropriate that that day marked the beginning of his Son's mission to redeem the world. Nine months later, we celebrate Jesus' birthday on Christmas.

Fr. West also pointed out that on December 8, we celebrate the Feast of Mary's Immaculate Conception. Nine months later, we celebrate Our Lady's birthday on September 8. Catholic Orthodox churches celebrate the Solemnity of St. John the Baptist's Conception on Sept. 23. The feast of the Nativity of John the Baptist is, you guessed it, nine months later on June 24.

In the work that we do at Mother and Unborn Baby Care, we abide by our longstanding and sacred tradition of honoring the sanctity of the conception of each person.

GENEROUS DONORS

This year, we gratefully received gifts of appreciated stock. With the stock market boom, many people have seen their stock portfolio grow in value. When appreciated stocks or bonds are sold, the owner has to pay capital gains tax on the value increase between the purchase and sales price. The benefit of gifting appreciated stocks and bonds is that the donor avoids paying capital gains tax and receives a charitable income tax deduction while providing support to MAUBC.



As year-end approaches, please keep in mind that this also applies to the yearly required minimum distributions from retirement plans (IRAs, Simple IRA, SEP IRA, etc.). (If your 70th birthday is after July 1, 2019, due to changes made by the SECURE Act, you do not need to make withdrawals until you reach age 72.)

NICOLE'S NEWS DIRECTOR OF CLIENT SERVICES

We have all witnessed much change in our communities and in our nation. Here at MAUBC, we have learned how to navigate and provide our services through the pandemic; yet the desperation we see in women today is one of the challenges we are facing as a pro-life pregnancy resource center. Nevertheless, our mission continues as we follow the Lord's calling to preserve and protect life.

Through August, our team has served 300 women with pregnancy tests, ultrasounds, peer counseling and baby boutique visits. We have also confirmed that 36 women have chosen life for their babies, and expect to confirm many more in the coming weeks!

As you know, ultrasound is a powerful tool in showing our clients the beauty inside the womb. A high school senior recently contacted us asking for an abortion. She felt unprepared emotionally to have a baby at such a young age. But after seeing her baby on the monitor, she quickly changed her mind, and her baby's arrival is expected at Christmas! What a perfect gift from God.

She said, "Thank you so much for showing me exactly what I needed to see to keep this baby, I'm so glad we came to you all."

A scared college student facing an unplanned pregnancy also came to us for help. She shared her dream of going to graduate school and the overwhelming pressure from those around her to abort her child.



Born in early 2021, this baby girl gave her mom more motivation to pursue a graduate degree this fall.

After the counseling session and seeing her baby on the ultrasound, this young woman bravely chose life for her little one. In the face of adversity, she told her family, "I'm keeping this baby!"

Her precious baby girl was born and the mom was accepted into her graduate program, so she spent the summer doubling up on classes. Far from derailing her life, our client shared that her baby is providing even more motivation to reach her goals. What an example of how women do not have to sacrifice their children for the sake of their happiness, education or careers.

These stories are just some examples of the miraculous work that God is doing at our center through your constant support. Your prayers, volunteer time and donations have a profound impact.

Please continue to pray that the Holy Spirit would guide our thoughts, words and actions.
